Half of Southeast Asians surveyed have never encountered the term 'invisible disabilities', and so we put them to a test



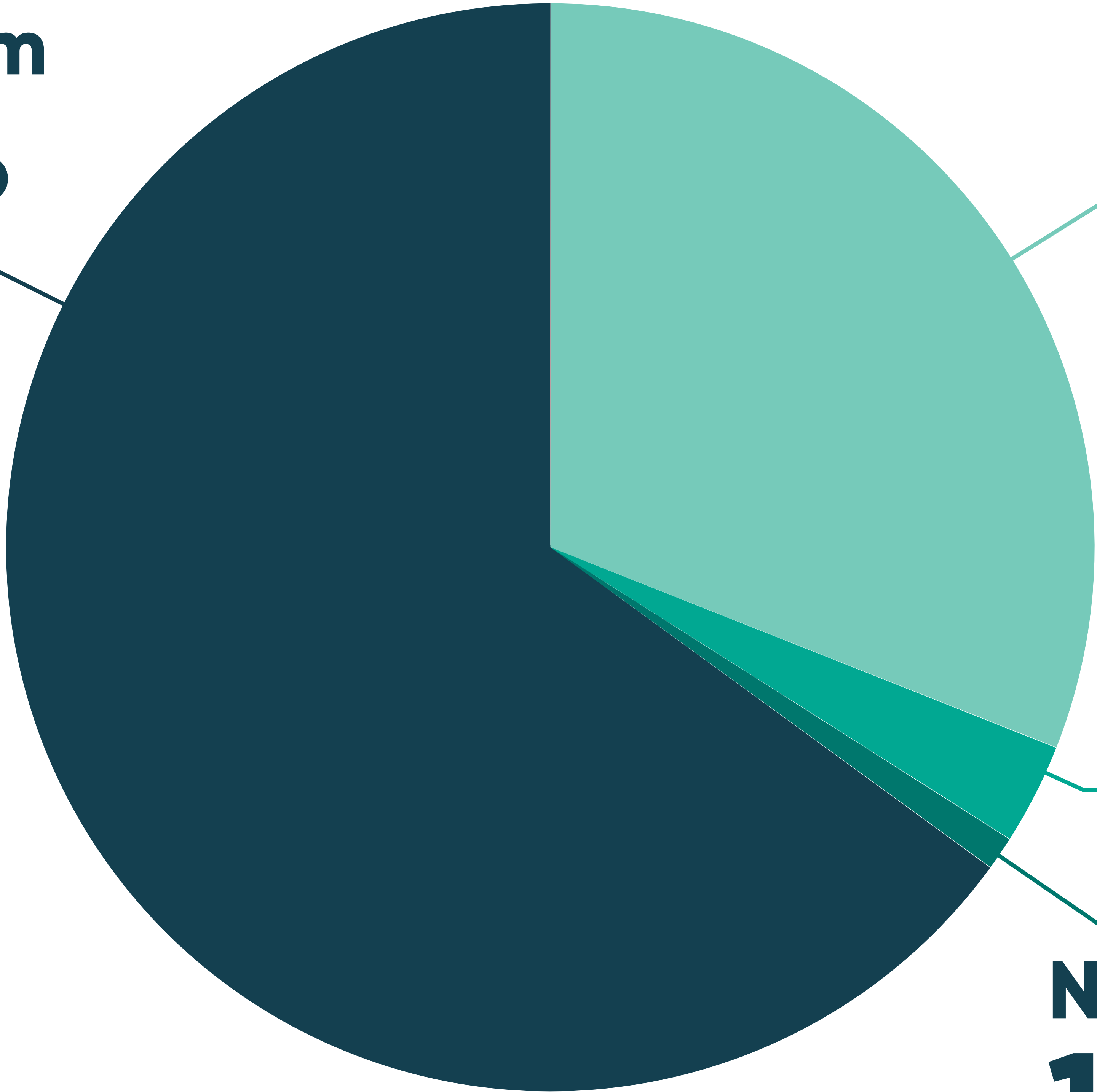
How many people with disabilities need assistive devices for daily tasks?

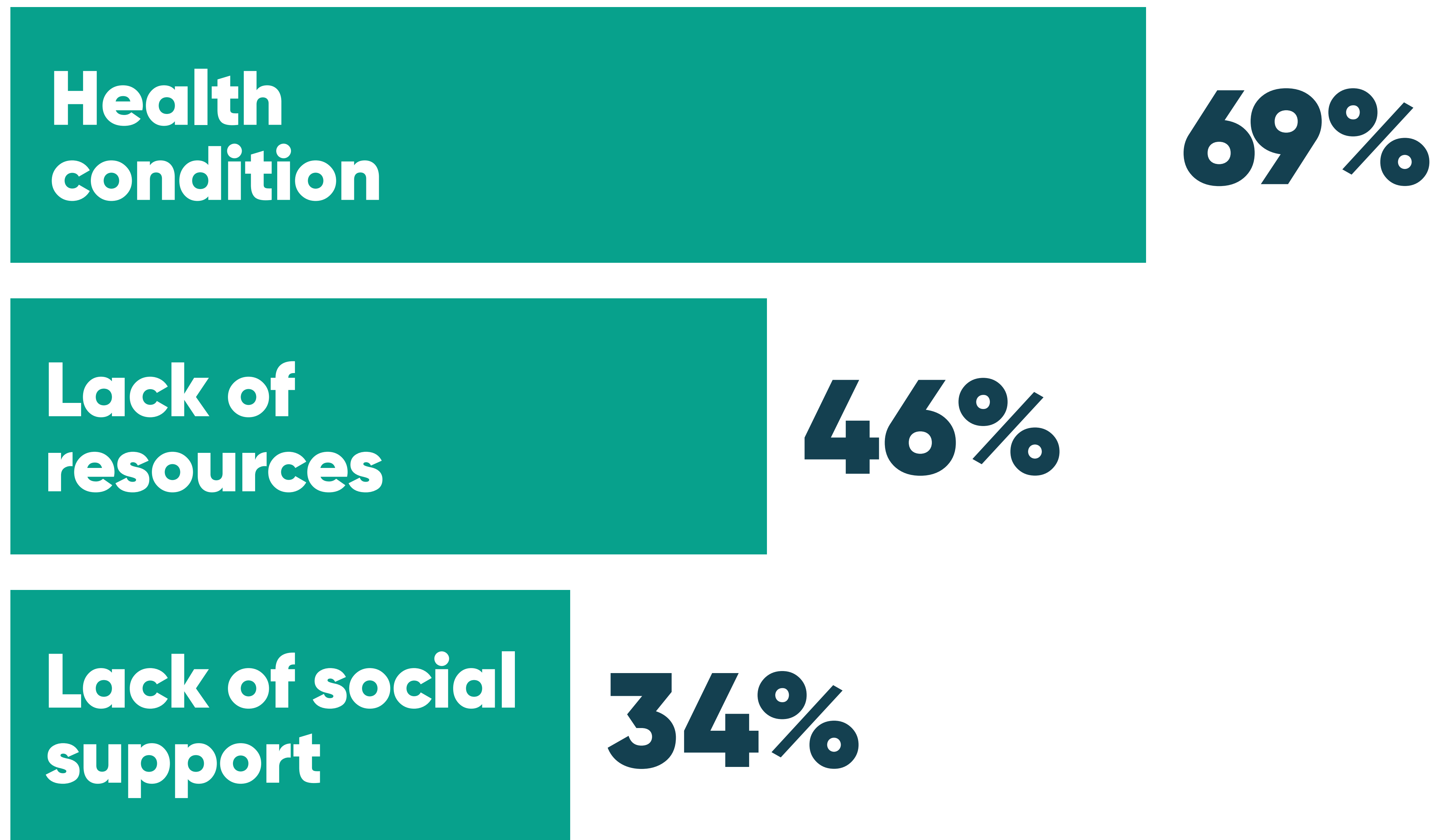
